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Harmony Aker, R.Ph., BCMTMS, earned her B.S. in Pharmacy from Rutgers University and has built a distinguished career spanning over two decades across community, retail, and mail-order pharmacy. She currently serves as the Pharmacist in Charge and Senior Manager at Amazon Pharmacy in Meridian, Idaho, where she leads regulatory compliance efforts across all U.S. jurisdictions and directs Amazon's regulatory change management program. A dedicated educator, Harmony has been precepting pharmacy students since 2008 and developed a Regulatory Affairs APPE rotation that offers hands-on experience in pharmacy law and policy. Her contributions to experiential education earned her Amazon Pharmacy's 2024 Preceptor of the Year award and a nomination from Washington State University. She is licensed in 39 states and holds multiple certifications, including MTM, immunization, and contraceptive education. Her leadership background includes impactful roles at Rite Aid, CVS Health, and Target, where she drove operational excellence and clinical program growth.
